are two of the most famous geological features of the Jurassic coast, and duly popular (summer/bank holidays best avoided). The most heavily used stretch along the South West Coast Path is that between the two of them, which involves a long steady climb from Lulworth Cove to the top of the hill and a corresponding descent to Durdle Door. Thankfully thereafter it's a good deal quieter as you continue along the rollercoaster-like grassy chalk cliffs - the stunning scenery and views well repay the effort! The walk leads to

the striking chalk headland of White Nothe continuing along the high cliffs above Ringstead Bay, with a return along an easier inland ridge-top route.

#### Start

Head to end of car park and follow wide stone-pitched Coast Path (CP) uphill to top, where it levels out, then dips down to a gate (Durdle Door car park up to R). Turn L down track to viewpoint above Durdle Door. As with Lulworth Cove and adjacent Stair Hole there are five types of rock exposed in the cliffs here (Durdle Door arch is of Portland stone). Either side are beaches of Man O'War Bay (to L) and Durdle Door (to R), good for swimming.



Continue along CP above beach, gently rising, then descending to dry valley of Scratchy Bottom. Steep climb up Swyre Head follows – great views back – then it's down, up, down and up again past a beacon. Beyond it path levels out, leading to Whitenothe Cottages. Turn L out onto headland, pass pillbox/lookout and bear L along top to stone bench with superb view E along chalk cliffs.

## Z 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> miles/5.4km

Return to CP, turning L to continue on cliff-top path to kissing gate. Fork R across grass (NT land) passing to R of dwelling. Go through kissing gate in far corner to join track at bend. 4<sup>4</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles/6.9km If starting from NT car park, keep ahead to return to it. Otherwise turn immediately R through another gate onto stone track, passing barn on R. Route continues as grassy track/path through fields. Keep ahead at junction (not marked on OS map) indicating East Chaldon to L and Warren and CP to R.

**56**% miles/10.6km Go through bridle gate (noting waymarks on post alongside) into another field. Take R fork maintaining direction and height, heading towards some scrub by a fence. Continue along grass to R of scrub. After turning on R for Scratchy Bottom, path, now a track, reaches Newlands Farm. Turn R along access road and R again down road to Durdle Door Holiday Park. Where road forks just past turning area, branch off L along path that runs through belt of trees on edge of Park.

67¾ miles/12.4km Exit woodland through gate and turn L signed for West Lulworth. Path heads gently downhill. At signpost by gate on L, keep ahead by fence on L, then L to start. CMM
