

O3 HAMPSHIRE THE RUFUS STONE

Distance: 7 miles/11.5km Time: 4½ hours Grade: Moderate





CHOSEN BY... NICK HALLISSEY This walk pulls together some of

the finest scenery in the New Forest, including both its archetypal landscapes of dense forestry and open heathland, as well as two very pleasant ponds. The walk has its apex at the Rufus Stone. which allegedly marks the site of an oak tree where King William II (known as Rufus. and son of the Conqueror) died after being accidentally struck by an arrow while hunting. There is still much mystery and disagreement about elements of the story: Accident? Murder? Conspiracy? A curse? Did it even happen here? But whatever the truth.

this is a gorgeous walk bookmarked by two fine pubs: the Royal Oak at the start/end point, and the Sir Walter Tyrrell (named after the accidental kingslayer) halfway round.

Start

Leave village green and pass pub L. Head E on lane. After ½ mile, at first junction by village green, turn R on lane. At next junction by small green, take L fork and continue to reach Forest Road. Cross to far side and enter woodland, veering R on wide grassy path. Where path splits, take R fork over heathland, reaching edge of car park. Turn L on path roughly E, down between two plantations. Pass through gap in fence to reach crossing track at bottom.



13/4 miles/2.8km Turn R. pass through gate and continue on track which soon veers R. At first junction. turn L on broad track into King's Garn Gutter Inclosure. Continue for just over ½ mile, eventually passing through gate. As track veers sharp R to ioin metalled track, turn L on path heading into woodland. Path becomes prominent and stony, passing through clearings and down to cross Coalmeer Gutter (ford), Pass through next clearing and continue on main path, ignoring forks. Path opens onto wide heath to Sir Walter Tyrrell pub.

7 3 miles/5km Turn R on lane (or L if exiting pub) and follow to small open green, R. home of the Rufus Stone marker Turn R heading SW over clearing then passing through gap in bushes. Continue uphill over heathland to reach crossing track. Turn R and follow track, parallel to A31. (Detour R to scenic Stanlidge Pond if desired.) Continue on track for just under 1 mile. to reach Forest Road.

41/2 miles/7.1km Turn R and follow path beside road for 1 mile, crossing access track to Beechwoods campsite and continuing to reach access track to scenic Janesmoor Pond, Circle round pond, then at far end, cross grass back to road.

53/4 miles/9.3km

Cross road and follow track on far side (W). Just after track veers sharp L. take first metalled track R and follow round north edge of North Bentley Inclosure. Track becomes enclosed and descends through woods. Cross footbridge. Turn R, climbing on track which then passes L of large white house. Follow track uphill to reach Fritham village green and car park. CW
