Distance: 6¾ miles/10.8km Time: 3½ hours Grade: Challenging








CUMBRIAN COPPERMINES



CHOSEN BY... **MATTHEW PIKE** Walk through the extensive remains

of the coppermines that once thrived in this golden valley. Expect gaping crevices where waterwheels once turned, tunnels leading deep beneath

the surface and 'inclines' leading up the hillside. Once leaving the shores of a small reservoir this walk climbs to the summit of the Old Man of Coniston with far-reaching views of the southern Lake District and as far as Blackpool Tower and the Isle of Man.





■ Start

From church entrance, turn R. then first L down Hawkshead Old Road. Continue past the cemetery, briefly reioin main road then turn L along Shepherd's Bridge Lane, cross main road then continue along lane opposite.

↑ ½ mile/0.7km LStay R where YHA entrance forks L. Just before row of houses follow footpath sign L up to gate. Turn L. follow wall. then turn R at lane and follow uphill until small dam where valley opens out in front of you. Take R fork uphill, passing between two spoil heaps.

11/4 miles/2km Ignore first L towards

cottages then, when track bends sharp R. take L fork along valley side above youth hostel. Reach ruin of Old Engine Shaft with a nearby shaft to R. Cross stream and continue past ruins of New Engine Shaft. Head over watercourse then straight up the incline.

2 miles/3.2km Three quarters of the way up is a level into which it's possible to look inside. At top of incline, a grass path leads to a ridge. Turn R towards Levers Water. Once at the outflow. turn L following lake edge, passing impressive shafts that look like volcanic vents. Path rises then bends R above lake edge.

2½ miles/4km

At the far side of the lake. just after crossing the first significant stream, path bends L. ascending steeply and aiming for the L of two cols sitting close together. After initial climb path veers slightly L, following several cairns, before the steepest section leads to the ridge. Turn L at the top and stick to the summit. resisting the temptation to take good track sidling to the R of ridge.

[™] 3¼ miles/5.1km

Ridge leads to one summit, then continues to top of The Old Man of Coniston, after which path veers L and zigzags steeply downhill. Turn R at Low Water and soon pass remains of slate quarries, spoil heaps and old machinery.

5 miles/8km

Path drops and winds between hillocks. Take second of two clear paths branching L, heading initially towards youth hostel. Path drops down to Church Beck. Continue to R of stream. Path becomes track then lane. Turn L at end. passing The Sun pub on L. Turn L again at main road, then immediately straight on when


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
