26 PERTH & KINROSS SCHIEHALLION

Distance: 6 miles/10km > Time: 4 hours > Grade: Challenging

peak of Schiehallion holds an important place in history both in our own personal history, being the first Munro either of us climbed, and in the grander history of astronomy. A memorial at the foot of the mountain commemorates the Schiehallion Experiment of 1774. in which Astronomer Roval, Nevil Maskelvne, and mathematician and surveyor, Charles Hutton, succeeded in estimating the mean density of the earth by observing the deflection of a plumb line by the mountain's gravitational pull. Groundbreaking scientific discoveries aside, the walk up

the gently rising winding trail, finishing with some enjoyable boulder-hopping to reach a summit commanding 360-degree views, is a truly memorable day out.

Start

The walk begins at the Braes of Foss car park, taking the obvious path south-west from the back of the car park. Follow the path as it ascends gently for about 1km, reaching a R turn onto the main Schiehallion path by some ruined enclosures. The main path has only followed this route since the John Muir Trust undertook five years of work to move it from its previous course which had deeply scarred the mountainside.





long, rising ridge of Schiehallion. Look out for ptarmigan, mountain hares and black grouse as you go; ptarmigan are often so well camouflaged against the rocky ground that they're right by your feet before you notice them. Continue up the path to an elevation of about 800m where the path peters out onto a boulder field.

71¾ miles/2.9km

>Follow the vague ridgeline across the boulders for another 1.5km, passing several cairns to reach the summit. In good weather the way from the end of the path to the summit and back is fairly obvious, but in poor visibility it's easy to lose your way and taking a bearing is recommended. Clambering up onto the unmarked blocky plateau at the top is a fitting finale, rewarded with 360-degree mountain views. The view west across Rannoch Moor to the peaks of Glencoe is particularly dramatic.

3 miles/5km

Return by the outbound route, taking in the glorious views in the opposite direction as you go. Don't be tempted to cut straight down the old path as it's still recovering after many years of use.
