A SYMPHONY OF SUFFOLK SIGHTS

Snape Maltings is home to a renowned concert hall, shops, galleries and restaurants. It is one of the main sites of the Aldeburgh Festival, founded by Benjamin Britten, who lived in the town, and it also hosts the Snape Proms in the summer. Two long-distance paths, the Suffolk Coast Path, and the Sandlings Walk. intersect at Snape Maltings. This circuit combines a stretch of each to create a lovely walk. with a particularly scenic initial section along the river.

■ Start

From the entrance to Snape Maltings on the south side of Snape Bridge, walk alongside the river, then turn R along the wooden boundary boardwalk - good view of the concert hall on your R - to the Barbara Hepworth sculpture. Family of Man. In the field beyond is the shire horse sculpture. Perceval. Although there isn't a public right of way, it is (at present) permissible to walk round the field past the sculpture - just follow the trodden grass. Bearing R you join the Suffolk Coast Path and turn L. Follow the path across boardwalks and alongside the river to Iken Cliff, from where in the past vessels transported corn and coal to London and elsewhere.

1½ miles/2.5km The original Iken Hall, a large Victorian house, was the setting for a children's opera by Britten, Today, idyllically situated overlooking the river here are Iken Barns, beautifully converted self catering barns. an ideal base for this and other walks in the area (see www. ikenbarns.com and www. suffolk-secrets.co.uk). The view from here towards the church in the distance is particularly fine. Continue along the riverside path to the road and turn L. then L again to atmospheric, part-thatched St Botolph's pilarim's church.

2½ miles/4km Retrace your steps to Iken Cliff and, continuing on the Suffolk Coast Path, turn L and L again to the road. Turn R. then Land head on southwards. The route takes you past fields of pigs, then through Tunstall Forest, crossing a couple of roads, to B1084 and Chillesford.

61/2 miles/10.5km Turn R passing the pub. then R along Pedlar's Lane (track). At the next junction. bear R. now following the Sandlings Walk, Keep ahead at another junction passing Bracken Farm on the R. Re-cross the B1078, continuing on a narrow path on the other side, keeping ahead (where a faint path forks L) to a track. Turn L and soon R. with another R bend a few yards on. A signpost here says Snape 3.5 miles. Keep following the Sandlings Walk waymarks

9½ miles/15.25km From here the route leads to Blaxhall Heath/Common. Cross the B1069 and at the next road junction turn R to return to Snape Maltings. CW


