

3 WILTSHIRE STONEHENGE

Distance: 6 miles/9.6km Time: 3 hours Grade: Easy





CHOSEN BY... NIGEL VILE This walk enables Britain's best-known

ancient monument to be viewed from a distance, within its natural setting, far away from the hustle and bustle of the tourist traffic. Salisbury Plain is, after all, a landscape of open vistas and expansive views, something that cannot be appreciated from within the narrow confines of the stones themselves. Along the way lie a number of important archaeological sites, including Durrington Walls, Woodhenge, the Cuckoo Stone, the Old King Barrows, the Avenue and the Cursus - a linear enclosure that early antiquarians believed was a venue for

Roman chariot races. It's truly a walk through the pages of ancient history.

Start

Walk along the road, passing the entrance to Woodhenge on the L. before passing a gate into the Cuckoo Stone enclosure Walk across this field to a gate in its far R corner. Bear L and drop down to a track, the course of an old army railway line, and follow this track to the L. In 0.75km, and 100m before an electricity pylon, pass through a gap on the R to join a track. Follow this track - signposted to the 'Old King Barrows and Stonehenge' - for 1.2km, before keeping on the track as it bears R.


ROUTE

Start/parking Woodhenge car park, grid ref SU151433, nearest postcode SP4 7AR Is it for me? An easy, gently undulating walk on bridle tracks and over the open access ground of Salisbury Plain Stiles None

PLANNING

Nearest town Amesbury Refreshments A few minutes' drive from the start is Durrington's Stonehenge Inn, with an exact replica of the ancient stones in its garden (01722 433186). More choice in Durrington and Amesbury Public toilets None



13/4 miles/2.8km In 75m, turn L at a junction with another 'King Barrows' sign. Follow this track, it bears L along the way, to reach an information board about 'The Avenue' and a handgate on the R in 320m. Pass through this gateway and walk across the field ahead, dropping downhill to reach a handgate in a fence in 0.5km. Bevond this gate, walk ahead to another information board before bearing L to walk uphill towards Stonehenge. On reaching a fence in front of this monument, turn R and follow the line of fences that wind

their way to a gate and track in

250m. Follow this track to the R for 0.6km to a point where the track has started to drop downhill and there are handgates either side of the track and a Cursus information board Continue down this track for 75 m to another pair of gates.

7 3½ miles/5.6km

Pass through the handgate on R and walk across to the far L corner of field ahead - this is the course of the Cursus. Pass through a gate, cross a small paddock to another gate and follow the left edge of the next field for 0.8km to a gate and track that leads to a crossroads. Follow the enclosed path opposite for 0.8km to a gap on the L by an MoD sign. Turn L up to a handgate and enter an enclosure that was passed earlier in the walk Walk diagonally across the middle of this field to a gate and the road by the Woodhenge monument, before turning R back to the parking area. CW
