CHOSEN BY **ROGER BUTLER** For most people, the name Table Mountain

conjures images of a striking summit in South Africa But there's another one closer to home, perched above the busy little town of Crickhowell in the Brecon Beacons This distinctive plateau. disconcertingly set at a slight angle, was once home to a large Iron Age fort. Its original name was Crug Hywel - hence today's Crickhowell. This breezy circuit initially climbs up to the old fort, from where there are wonderful views across the wide valley of the River Usk, before heading north to traverse a section of the Black Mountains.

Start

From the church and pub in I lanbedr walk west up the lane and, at the top of the steep hill, turn R at a T-junction for 500m.

34 mile/1.2km

Take the gate on L signed Perth-y-Pia and walk steeply up rough tarmac track to building (now a bunkhouse). Go R of house to stile by gate and walk straight ahead up to stile at another gate by iunction of walls. Keep ahead over open hillside and trend L

towards plateau summit of

7 1⅓ miles/2.1km

Table Mountain.

Turn north from the top on a broad grass track, with a wall



curling away on R. Cross the dip and climb uphill to pass large cairn after 1.75km. Continue ahead to reach the trig pillar on Pen Cerrig-calch

and follow the path, surfaced in places, to pass another cairn. Continue along the broad open ridge to Pen Alltmawr, the highest top, with a damaged trig pillar and a

41/4 miles/6.8km Walk north, down a sharp drop, and continue on grass to bend R and then fork R to the next top. Pen Twyn Glas. Now follow the established path downhill along the ridge of Tal Trwvnau, past small old quarries and tall cairn, and veer L on old track towards forestry. Cross stile in wall and continue on grass track to follow edge of conifers (a few wavmarkers here). Meet wall on R and proceed on stony track between walls to a stile by a gate. Cross a second stile to join a narrow path in trees which soon descends into a deep shady holloway.

7½ miles/12km At the end of the holloway go over a stile at a junction of tracks and gates and follow fingerpost marked 'to road'. Walk along grass track but turn immediately L at next fingerpost on a permissive path, steeply downhill over field. to a track and a gate/ stile next to lane. Turn R over bridge and go R up steps (again, a signed permissive path) to stile in hedge. Go uphill over next field to stile at narrow lane. Go straight

across to stile and walk up side of wood to stile in wall at the foot of the steep open hillside.

6734 miles/12.5km
Turn L on path, with wall
on L. After 1.1km go L at gate
(not signed) and walk downhill
through trees. Pass through
another gate and follow path
down to cottage at lane.

78¾ miles/14km Turn R and take stile on L after 250m. Walk on old track for 40m then take small gate on R. Go L along field edge, pass cottage/barn on L and cross stile by gate. Join track to small gate at lane and turn L downhill to Llanbedr.
